- Strengthen democratic governance






## **OUR TEAM**








#### **DEMOCRACY**

## Requirements

- Citizenship You must be a US Citizen
- Foreign Service Officers must be cleared to the top-Secret level.
- This may take up to 4-5 months or more if you have lived overseas
- Medical clearance for worldwide availability
- Agency must receive official transcripts from university

## **PATHWAYS PROGRAMS**

#### Pathways Internship Program

- Must be a student & remain a student throughout the internship
- USAID offers a paid 12-week internship program
- Applications are accepted seasonally Fall/Winter, Winter/Spring, and Summer
- USAID offers a one-year internship program to further encourage careers in international development

#### Pathways Recent Graduates Program

- One year development Program
- Undergraduate and Graduates Qualify
